Two Non-resident Board Members' terms will be coming to an end at the Compass NS AGM this year. Nomination recommendations have been submitted to the CHF Canada Board for approval at their September 26, 2023, Board meeting.

Policy & Process

The current Spending Policy is being reviewed by CHF Canada and The Network management staff with consideration of the Board's feedback and Compass NSè operational requirements. The revised Spending Policy will be available for final review and adoption in early Fall.

Atlantic Summit CHF Canada

Compass NS plans to host a shared tradeshow booth at the event where they will be provided a small giveaway and information about Compass NS to fellow co-op members.

An invitation was sent to all Members and all those who expressed an interest have been approved to attend.


Three Board Members are planning to attend virtually and one Board Member and two Members plan to attend in-person.

Media and Communication

Website

In the 2023/24 annual plan the Board approved the production of a new website. Creative Curve Media has been retained and is committed to creating a website that is unique to Compass NS that incorporates the information from the current website in a much more organized and user-friendly manner.

Traffic is slightly down from last year (7%). It is believed to have been caused by the fact the ground was just breaking on the Maitland Street Development project last year so more people were going to the website to learn more about the development.



Interest in general information about the Coop, and how to apply are some of the highest traffic areas. 42 applications were submitted.

Sustainability, Growth & Development

Current Developments

Heritage Hall, Shelburne, NS - 5 Barton School, Digby NS - 8 Maitland Street, Halifax, NS - 57

Tri County

Two planning and pre-development applications have been submitted to the Nova Scotia Community Housing Growth Fund to support the Barton School and Heritage Hall development projects. The applications are currently being reviewed.

Maitland Street

Construction continues at the Maitland Street development site. Concrete pouring for Building 1 has progressed to Level 6 and Building 2 concrete structure is complete and exterior steel framing is progressing. The tower crane is anticipated to be removed in October.





The Maitland Street project will deliver 57 units of housing in two distinct low-rise buildings separated by an accessible pedestrian corridor. The project is situated in North End Halifax, near public transit, services, health care facilities and other amenities.

Capital Repair Projects

Compass NS received Co-operative Housing Infrastructure and Repair (CHIRP) funding through Municipal Affairs and Housing (DMAH) to complete renovations at Topshee, Central Dartmouth, Spanish Bay, New Armdale Westside and Gimmie Shelter Neighbourhoods.

Spanish Bay (\$2,458,100) Phase 3 will include HRV, electrical upgrades and heat pumps. Efficiency NS has approved a \$50,106 rebate.

Topshee (\$952,600) Phase 3 will include paving their 4 parking lots.

Central Dartmouth (\$349,620) funding is complete. The Neighbourhood received roof, siding, and exterior lighting; masonry and concrete foundation work; along with decks/front porches.

Gimmie Shelter and New Armdale Westside Neighbourhood will be receiving a combined total of \$3.6 million for capital repairs.

Maitland Street Sculpture

Compass NS is considering a proposal from a local Indigenous artist who is interested in collaborating with a Nova Scotia metal artist, to produce a sculpture for the Maitland Street development.
