Wrapping Up 2024/25

As the 2024/25 fiscal year draws to a close, the Board is finalizing its annual plan, which concludes on July 31, 2025. Over the past year, the Compass NS has concentrated on five strategic priorities:

Looking ahead, the 2025/26 annual plan—beginning August 1, 2025—builds on this foundation and aligns with the Board's long-term vision. The plan outlines three primary goals:

2024-2025 priorities:

- 1. strengthening community connections
- 2. enhancing governance capacity
- 3.improving organizational efficiency
- 4. exploring sustainable growth opportunities
- 5. promoting equity and inclusion.



2025-2026 priorities:

- increasing community presence through the completion of one project and the hosting of two community events
- 2. deepening member engagement via strategic planning, feedback initiatives, a new program launch and a comprehensive Bylaw review;
- 3. fostering growth and celebration by identifying a new growth opportunity and recognizing completed development projects.

We are enthusiastic about maintaining momentum and continuing collaborative efforts to achieve these objectives.

Based on your feedback from the General Membership Meeting survey, several steps have been introduced to improve communication and engagement across the co-op:


Currently in progress are:

- updates to the Members-only section of the website, aimed at improving access to important documents and timely updates
- Exploring the addition of Q&A sessions following General Meetings to encourage open dialogue.

In addition to these ongoing efforts, two key actions have already been completed:

- the implementation of a clearer communication process to ensure consistent and transparent updates
- the development distribution of a sample "Terms of Reference" to support the creation of Member-led committees.


Our participation not only strengthened our connections within the co-operative housing sector but also brought back fresh insights and ideas to support our ongoing work and strategic goals.

We're pleased to announce that we have completed a three-year donation commitment to Rooftops Canada – Abri International to support the organization.



The development is complete, except for a few remaining deficiencies.


